- Entire professional career at LEI (now Wageningen Economic Research) in The Hague, The Netherlands.

Service to the profession

- Krijn Poppe has contributed to the advancement of the profession in Europe for a long period of years, with many achievements.
- Krijn Poppe was Secretary-General of the European Association of Agricultural Economists from 1999 to 2011. During this term he:
 - o incorporated the association with legal statutes.
 - made resources available at the LEI to run the EAAE office
 - o professionalized the association.
 - was a driving force in the project with the Agricultural Economics Society to establish EUROCHOICES as policy oriented outreach journal and he chairs its Steering Group.
 - Since 2013 he is Honorary Secretary-Treasurer of the EAAEP Foundation that publishes the official journal of the EAAE, the European Review of Agricultural Economics.
- He became quickly involved in the Farm Accountancy Data Network (FADN), policy analysis and the management of the institute. In the EU's FADN was and is a driving force of innovation, recently on the collection of sustainability data.

With his long-term interest in information and communication technology Krijn worked in the last five years also on the innovation, business models and governance of ICT-platforms in agriculture which led to policy papers on issues like data ownership for the OECD, European Parliament and the Dutch government.

Administration

After joining LEI Wageningen UR (Wageningen Economic Research), Krijn Poppe became quickly involved in the management of the institute. He helped to move the institute from a status of "civil servants with input finance" to a market oriented organisation", as part of Wageningen University and Research with strong interaction with policy makers in The Hague and Brussels.
