Agricultural Economics Society: Research support

In celebration of our Centenary year, the AES Executive Committee has established the Centenary Postgraduate Research Support (CPRS) fund allocating a total of £100,000 over three years. This will provide tuition or stipend co-support, top-up scholarships, skills-based support, professional development workshops and publication support grants.

Supervisors are responsible for applying to the fund and must have at least three years recent continuous AES membership, plus either recent AES conference attendance or have recently published in the *JAE* or *EuroChoices*. Research topics must align to the aims and objectives of the AES, and students will be expected to contribute to AES conferences and/or submit work to the *JAE* or *EuroChoices*. Third party co-funding is welcomed and organisations and institutions wishing to co-support CPRS should contact paul.wilson@nottingham.ac.uk. The application process will be announced via AES mailing and hosted on the AES website www.aes.ac.uk in the coming months.

Agricultural Economics Society: Travel support

The Society continues to make £10,000 available annually to part fund attendance at selected conferences and to undertake study visits.

Applications are evaluated and scored against agreed criteria by a panel of three drawn from the

AES Executive Committee. Offers will be made in merit order after assessment within assigned budget limits.

Both applications for support to attend conferences and applications to undertake a study visit are invited under two calls closing on 1st June and 1st November each year.

In addition to research articles, the journal also publishes review articles. Review articles should provide a comprehensive and scholarly account of a topic that has direct relevance to agricultural economics (methodological or applied) and that has not recently been covered in the literature. Normally these are authored by individuals who have themselves made a significant contribution to the topic under review and/or are acknowledged authorities in the field. A pre-submission enquiry to is required for review articles. An abstract, outline and key references should be

emailed to erae.editorialoffice@theeditorialhub.com. Review article submissions undergo the normal review process.
